Financial Information

Registration: Registration fees are one-time payments turned in with the student application. **Registration fees are non-refundable at any time.** Registration fees are not one per family, but one per student. Registrations will be considered firm only when the registration fee is paid and the online application is completed.

Placement Exams: Placement exams are required for new students, and so this must be completed as well before a student is considered fully registered. **Class sizes are very limited and capped** so register and schedule an entrance exam soon.

Acceptance: Once a student has been officially accepted, he or she will be assigned to a particular level based on the results of his or her placement exam.

	Grade Equivalent
Jr. K	Appropriate level for 4-5 year olds
Level K	Appropriate level for 5-6 year olds. This is our "learning to read" level.
Level 100	Appropriate for 1 st graders or 2 nd graders still working on reading fluency.
Level 200	Appropriate for 2 nd graders and 3 rd graders who need another year to focus on strengthening reading comprehension/math skills.
NEW! Level A	Appropriate for 3 rd and 4 th graders, and struggling 5 th graders.

Book Fee: **Book fees are due May 1, 2018.** The book fee is non-refundable.

Tuition: Tuition is a full year commitment. Since we build our budget and hire teachers based upon expected tuition income, **parents are responsible for the full tuition**, even if a student voluntarily withdraws or is expelled mid-year. Payment plans are available by the semester.

Enclosed Forms: A Tuition contract, Statement of Faith, and Student Code of Conduct is included. These completed forms with signatures are required once a student has been officially accepted.



Payment Options [Select One]

- o Payment in full by June 1, 2018 (5% discount on tuition will be applied)
- o Semester payments due August 1, 2018 and January 1, 2019.

Late/Bounced Payments

Payments more than 5 days late will incur a \$25 late penalty fee. Bounced checks will incur a \$25 processing fee in addition to the late fee. Accounts overdue by 25 days will be additionally subject to interest charges at 1.5% per month and full tuition will become immediately due. Accounts become delinquent once a payment is 55 days overdue.

Full Year Obligation

I understand that I, the parent/guardian, have committed to paying tuition for the entire school year, even if the student is expelled. If a student withdraws before August 1, 2018, only half tuition will be due. After August 1, 2018, full tuition will be due. However, a prorated rebate, not to exceed half of tuition, will be granted in the following circumstances:

- o The student moves outside the greater San Antonio area (50 miles from the school). 60 day written notice is required.
- o The student experience extended physical illness or injury and is unable to attend school the remainder of the year. A doctor's note is required.

By signing and returning this form, you agree to the following:

- o I have read and agree to the above and agree to pay tuition on time according to the schedule I have selected.
- o I understand that Aberdeen Latin School may, without exclusion of other actions, withhold school records and transcripts or suspend the student if tuition obligations are not met by the parent(s)/guardian(s).
- o I understand that delinquent accounts will be subject to debt collection, including legal action, and I am responsible for any fees incurred during that process.
